What you will need:

- Music from a radio, CDs, Spotify (or similar) or live performance
- · Drawing or writing materials



What to do:

- Play different music styles and songs to your child, such as jazz, classical, country and western, rock and roll, techno, modern, rhythm and blues, electronic, rock and other cultural styles.
- Ask your child to respond to the music with drawing, dance, writing or other forms of expression.
- 3. Talk to your child about how the music makes them feel.



What learning is happening:

Children begin to learn about rhythm and music structure through experiencing different music styles. They develop an appreciation and understanding of how music makes them feel and explore ways to express these feelings. Listening to live music provides an opportunity for children to develop understanding of what it means to be part of an audience.
