SOCIAI MCCIA use outside of school

We are writing to advise you of a few concerns that we have regarding children's use of social media outside of school during evenings and weekends.

It has recently come to light that there are several groups of students using social media to share graphic/explicit content and persistently being unkind about other students over platforms such as Snapchat, WhatsApp and Messenger. We understand that this has included both sharing unkind comments about students and sharing inappropriate images. This is leading to both upset and concerned students within the school and is not in line with our school's digital technologies agreement, ethos, or values.

Most Social media apps are for teenagers 13 years and over, which includes TikTok. If you do allow your child to access social media, we ask for your vigilance. Just like their interactions in person, online interactions require supervision and support. What is right will vary from family to family but some strategies that are known to be successful include:

- Monitoring their devices/phones for the apps that are downloaded
- Enacting parental controls on phones and consoles.
- Reviewing the messages, they send on platforms and apps making monitoring part of a daily or weekly routine.
- Setting expectations about what space (preferably communal) and times they have access to devices.
- Encouraging them to share or discuss with you what they are doing.

We are asking for your partnership in dealing with this, as this is happening outside of school.

As a school, we are responding to this with additional teaching during Digital Technology, Online Citizenship, and Wellbeing lessons and in 1:1 conversations and teaching opportunities as they arise.

In addition, we are requesting that the following apps be deleted from devices being brought to school please:

- Snapchat
- Whats App
- TikTok
- Instagram
- Facebook


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Social Media Settings

Most social media apps are 13+ (WhatsApp is 16+) but - as we are aware some children are using them regularly - we wanted to share some important settings to keep children safe online.








PRIVATE ACCOUNT: when this is on, only followers can see your posts and stories and you have to approve followers (recommended: on)

COMMENTS, TAGS, MENTIONS, STORY: allows you to control who can tag you, comment on your posts, mention you in their story and control your story audience

You can also restrict, block or report a user by clicking on their profile and selecting the three dots in the top right.

You can also remove a follower using this method.







PRIVATE ACCOUNT: when this is on, only followers can see your posts and you have to approve followers (recommended: on)

SAFETY: Tiktok has lots of options to restrict contact and interaction with video posts (recommended: friends)

COMMENT FILTERS: you can automatically hide comments that may have offensive words in (recommended: on)

You can also block, report or remove a follower by clicking on their profile and clicking the three dots in the top right hand corner.



PROFILE PHOTO AND STATUS: You can change who can see a profile photo and status (recommended: my contacts)

GROUPS: allows you to stop a contact being able to add you to groups (recommended for when a friend adds you without permission)

BLOCKED: can add a contact to a blocked list so they can't message you.

You can also block or report a contact/ number by clicking on the chat with them, clicking on their number/name at the top then scrolling down!



CONTACT: decide who can message you and send you snaps (recommended: my friends)

VIEW MY STORY: restrict who can see your story (recommended: my friends)

GHOST MODE: if this isn't on, contacts can see your location on a map (recommended: on)

You can also block or report a user by locating their contact, tapping and holding their name and clicking more

Travel Education Initiative

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are excited to inform you about an upcoming initiative aimed at enhancing our students' travel experience to and from school. Over the next few weeks, we will be implementing a new system to identify how our students travel and what level of support they require to transition to their mode of transport.

Each student will be provided with bag tags containing essential information such as their name, room number, days of travel, level of support needed, and mode of transportation (bus, car, OSCH, walking/cycling). This system will not only streamline our efforts but also ensure the safety and efficiency of our students' travel arrangements.

We believe that this new system will greatly benefit our students, from Preps to our most senior students, by supporting their ongoing travel education. It will also enable our staff to identify students and provide the necessary assistance for a smooth transition to their designated travel options quickly and accurately.

Our support levels will be categorized using a traffic light system:

- Red: 1:1 support by either parents or staff
- Yellow: Supervised support
- Green: Independent travel

On the next pages, you will find posters providing examples of the tags and further details regarding the traffic light support system.


If your child misplaces their tag, please notify the classroom staff, and replacement tags will be promptly provided to ensure continuity in their travel arrangements.






new things. Well done!

THERAPY CORNER

FIRST/THEN VISUAL

At Officer Specialist School we use visuals with all of our students, on a daily basis. One of our most effective visuals is one that indicates what a student is required to do FIRST, THEN what will follow it. We find this visual is useful for...

- Helping students to understand very basic sequencing
- Helping students to complete activities (both preferred and not preferred)
- Being a building block for students to successfully use a more complex visual schedule
- Increasing students' ability to complete tasks and participate in their daily schedules with more independence
- Assisting students with transitions within the school
- Helping students to know what to expect
 next
- Encouraging students to understand choice making

How to use the First/Then Visual.

•We start with the scheduled activity being followed by a strong reinforcer (e.g., first work with the teacher, then play dough). •Then show the student the first/then card, point to the two symbols, and say "First (Activity 1), then (Activity 2)". If the student resists or gets off task, show them the card again and repeat this phrase.

- When the first activity is done, show the student the first/then card again and say "(Activity 1) is finished!" while pointing at the first visual on the card. Then point to the second activity and say "Now, (Activity 2)."
- Begin Activity 2 immediately so that the student can form the connection between the visual and the activity.


